Polyfollia festival 2010: 4th World Showcase and Marketplace for Choral Singing

This event is the biennial reference meeting point for the best emerging young professional or amateur ensembles and for music promoters and concert organizers involved in this field.

Polyfollia aims to promote a cappella choral work at its best, presenting choral music ranging from early to contemporary, from traditional to jazz and from classical to pop, acoustic or amplified, from 4 to 40 singers, children or adults, equal voices or mixed choirs, from all regions of the world.

At the same time, Polyfollia is a huge "choral festive party" where all singers meet and mix.

Some figures from the 2008 edition of Polyfollia: 42 concerts with 14 selected ensembles from 13 countries / 4 continents, 114 mini-concerts, workshops & free events, with 58 amateurs choirs from France, 98 music promoters, concert organizers and professionals from 28 countries, general audience: 31 000, festival staff: 52 + 140 volunteers.

Study Tour Coordinator: Jean-Marie Puissant (France)



Jean-Marie Puissant is a leading figure of the French choral stage.

He is today the musical director of Variatio choir, Nicolas de Grigny choir, Female Quartet of Paris and National Youth Choir (A Coeur Joie), he founded the choir of Sorbonne Nouvelle University (Paris) and he is the musical director of Collèges de l'Essonne choirs.

He is also a singer. His career led him to work with great conductors like Herreweghe, Christie, Corboz, Boulez, Barenboïm, Gardiner, Piquemal, Nagano, Bertini, etc.

He is at last an orchestra conductor : Orchestre National d'Île de France, Savaria Symphonia of Hungary, Philharmonic of Lorraine region, Paris-Sorbone Orchestra, etc.

He addresses some main pieces of the operatic repertoire (La flûte Enchantée, Traviata, Falstaff, Tosca, etc.)

He knows the festival Polyfolia very well from the beginning : he conducted the French National Youth Choir in the 1st World Showcase in 2004. He has been also one of the lecturers in the International Forum on Voice, Youth and Arts Management in Caen – February 2008.
